My dear Major Moedebeck.

I found your letter of Dec. 31° here upon my arrival a week ago and now have that of Jan. 11.

I will at once prepare the continuation of Lilienthal's article for you, and mail it about February 15°, but it will not contain Wright's co-efficients for curved surface, as his experiments have not yet been computed. I sent you 6 copies of his address and suggest that you do not say much about its technics in the Aer. Mitth. so as to reserve this for the Taschenbuch.

I enclose a newspaper clipping, the test of which (not the pictures) is almost accurate. I have taken the liberty of suggesting you for the German member of the International Commission and given your address. I hope that you can serve. I have also suggested M<sup>~</sup> Rotch. I think M<sup>~</sup> Leutsch will not serve. Who would you suggest for France, for England and for Russia on the Commission? We expect, of course, to make a rough draft of the conditions for prizes and contests in this country and to confer with the foreign members by correspondence.

I will send the list of words later.
