My dear Major Moedebeck

I wrote you May 13<sup>th</sup>, sending some modifications of my article, and I now enclose the remainder.

After trying to follow Lilienthal's method of resolving the forces in gliding flight upon the horizontal, I concluded to resolve them on the path. You should therefore change the last sentence in the copy sent you, after the word "approximations", to read:

"The following diagram represents the analysis of the forces as probably considered by Lilienthal but projected upon the path instead of horizontally".

I asked the Messrs Wright for a copy of their plans of gliding machine, to be made at my expense. They answered that they had nothing but rough sketches, having developed their design as the work progressed, but that they would make a set of plans for you. I am still waiting for those plans.
